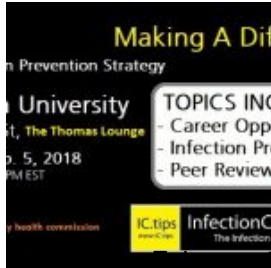


TIPS: Making A Difference: Ryerson University
